

# The Religious Right in America is Dead

I'm Rick Wiles, today is Friday November 9, 2012. The religious right in America is dead. And so too, are the political purists in the church, who think that the answer is more extreme political action without compromise. Both sides in the religious right, the compromisers and the purists, have nothing to offer us. Let us banish their politics forever. Let us banish their politics forever and return to preaching the three B's: The Blood, the Book, and the Blessed hope.

My e-mail box is filled with messages from Christians from across American and many other countries who want me to lead the fight to help purify the Republican Party. Or help start a new Christian Patriot Party.

My reply: Forget it! I have no interest in such a futile endeavor. I will serve my remaining years on this earth preaching the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. I have no interest in helping Dave Barton and Glenn Beck, and the American Family Association and the Family Research Council or any other political group or political activists try to save America through political actions.

Likewise, I'm not interested in rallying around Ron Paul and the Libertarians or the Tea Party movement to fight the Obamanistas. Quite frankly, I'm done with the news. I'm finished with interviewing people talking about the news. And I plan to make a transition, over the coming months, to something new. The message however, won't be new. It will be as old as Calvary's Cross.

You know a factory planning to produce a new product must retool the assembly line. You can't retool for the new product line while still churning out the old widgets. A new widget requires retooling the new assembly line. And that's what we're going to do.

But I don't want anybody to think that I'm quitting. I'm amazed at the number of e-mails from people calling me a quitter. I'm not a quitter, I'm a fighter. There are times, however, when you have to change your tactics if you want to stay in the fight to win, and this is one of those times.
