## **Cursed is the Nation that Shuns God**

**Deuteronomy 28:36-37**  $\frac{36}{5}$  The Lord will bring you and the king whom you set over you to a nation which neither you nor your fathers have known, and there you shall serve other gods-wood and stone.  $\frac{37}{5}$  And you shall become an astonishment, a proverb, and a byword among all nations where the Lord will drive you.

**Fulfillment:**  $2 ext{ Kings } 24:13-16^{13}$  And he carried out from there all the treasures of the house of the Lord and the treasures of the king's house, and he cut in pieces all the articles of gold which Solomon king of Israel had made in the temple of the Lord, as the Lord had said.  $^{14}$  Also he carried into captivity all Jerusalem: all the captains and all the mighty men of valor, ten thousand captives, and all the craftsmen and smiths. None remained except the poorest people of the land.  $^{15}$  And he carried Jehoiachin captive to Babylon. The king's mother, the king's wives, his officers, and the mighty of the land he carried into captivity from Jerusalem to Babylon.  $^{16}$  All the valiant men, seven thousand, and craftsmen and smiths, one thousand, all who were strong and fit for war, these the king of Babylon brought captive to Babylon.

**Deuteronomy 28:38-42** <sup>38</sup> You shall carry much seed out to the field but gather little in, for the locust shall consume it. <sup>39</sup> You shall plant vineyards and tend them, but you shall neither drink of the wine nor gather the grapes; for the worms shall eat them. <sup>40</sup> You shall have olive trees throughout all your territory, but you shall not anoint yourself with the oil; for your olives shall drop off. <sup>41</sup> You shall beget sons and daughters, but they shall not be yours; for they shall go into captivity. <sup>42</sup> Locusts shall consume all your trees and the produce of your land.

**Fulfillment:** *Joel 1:1-5* <sup>1</sup> The word of the Lord that came to Joel the son of Pethuel. <sup>2</sup> Hear this, you elders, And give ear, all you inhabitants of the land! Has anything like this happened in your days, Or even in the days of your fathers? <sup>3</sup> Tell your children about it, Let your children tell their children, And their children another generation. <sup>4</sup> What the chewing locust left, the swarming locust has eaten; What the swarming locust left, the crawling locust has eaten; And what the crawling locust left, the consuming locust has eaten.

**Fulfillment:** *Joel* 1:10-13 <sup>10</sup> The field is wasted, The land mourns; For the grain is ruined, The new wine is dried up, The oil fails. <sup>11</sup> Be ashamed, you farmers, Wail, you vinedressers, For the wheat and the barley; Because the harvest of the field has perished. <sup>12</sup> The vine has dried up, And the fig tree has withered; The pomegranate tree, The palm tree also, And the apple tree-- All the trees of the field are withered; Surely joy has withered away from the sons of men. <sup>13</sup> Gird yourselves and lament, you priests; Wail, you who minister before the altar; Come, lie all night in sackcloth, You who

minister to my God; For the grain offering and the drink offering Are withheld from the house of your God.

Deuteronomy 28:43-51 <sup>43</sup> The alien who is among you shall rise higher and higher above you, and you shall come down lower and lower. <sup>44</sup> He shall lend to you, but you shall not lend to him; he shall be the head, and you shall be the tail. <sup>45</sup> Moreover all these curses shall come upon you and pursue and overtake you, until you are destroyed, because you did not obey the voice of the Lord your God, to keep His commandments and His statutes which He commanded you. <sup>46</sup> And they shall be upon you for a sign and a wonder, and on your descendants forever. <sup>47</sup> "Because you did not serve the Lord your God with joy and gladness of heart, for the abundance of everything, <sup>48</sup> therefore you shall serve your enemies, whom the Lord will send against you, in hunger, in thirst, in nakedness, and in need of everything; and He will put a yoke of iron on your neck until He has destroyed you. <sup>49</sup> The Lord will bring a nation against you from afar, from the end of the earth, as swift as the eagle flies, a nation whose language you will not understand, <sup>50</sup> a nation of fierce countenance, which does not respect the elderly nor show favor to the young. <sup>51</sup> And they shall eat the increase of your livestock and the produce of your land, until you are destroyed; they shall not leave you grain or new wine or oil, or the increase of your cattle or the offspring of your flocks, until they have destroyed you.

**Fulfillment:** *Habakkuk* 1:1-10 <sup>1</sup> The burden which the prophet Habakkuk saw. <sup>2</sup> O Lord, how long shall I cry, And You will not hear? Even cry out to You, "Violence!" And You will not save. <sup>3</sup> Why do You show me iniquity, And cause me to see trouble? For plundering and violence are before me; There is strife, and contention arises. <sup>4</sup> Therefore the law is powerless, And justice never goes forth. For the wicked surround the righteous; Therefore perverse judgment proceeds. <sup>5</sup> "Look among the nations and watch-- Be utterly astounded! For I will work a work in your days Which you would not believe, though it were told you. <sup>6</sup> For indeed I am raising up the Chaldeans, A bitter and hasty nation Which marches through the breadth of the earth, To possess dwelling places that are not theirs. <sup>7</sup> They are terrible and dreadful; Their judgment and their dignity proceed from themselves. <sup>8</sup> Their horses also are swifter than leopards, And more fierce than evening wolves. Their chargers charge ahead; Their cavalry comes from afar; They fly as the eagle that hastens to eat. <sup>9</sup> "They all come for violence; Their faces are set like the east wind. They gather captives like sand. <sup>10</sup> They scoff at kings, And princes are scorned by them. They deride every stronghold, For they heap up earthen mounds and seize it.

**Deuteronomy 28:52-57** <sup>52</sup> They shall besiege you at all your gates until your high and fortified walls, in which you trust, come down throughout all your land; and they shall besiege you at all your gates throughout all your land which the Lord your God has given you. <sup>53</sup> You shall eat the fruit of your own body, the flesh of your sons and your daughters whom the Lord your God has given you, in the siege and desperate straits in which your enemy shall distress you. <sup>54</sup> The sensitive and very refined man among you will be hostile toward his brother, toward the wife of his bosom, and toward the rest of his children whom he leaves behind, <sup>55</sup> so that he will not give any of them the flesh of his children whom he will eat, because he has nothing left in the siege and desperate straits in which your enemy shall distress you at all your gates. <sup>56</sup> The tender and delicate woman among you, who would not venture to set the sole of her foot on the ground because of her delicateness and sensitivity, will refuse to the husband of her bosom, and to her

son and her daughter,  $\frac{57}{1}$  her placenta which comes out from between her feet and her children whom she bears; for she will eat them secretly for lack of everything in the siege and desperate straits in which your enemy shall distress you at all your gates

Fulfillment in the Northern Kingdom (Samaria): 2 Kings 6:24-29. <sup>24</sup> Some time later, Ben-Hadad king of Aram mobilized his entire army and marched up and laid siege to Samaria. <sup>25</sup> There was a great famine in the city; the siege lasted so long that a donkey's head sold for eighty shekels of silver, and a quarter of a cab of seed pods for five shekels. <sup>26</sup> As the king of Israel was passing by on the wall, a woman cried to him, "Help me, my lord the king!" <sup>27</sup> The king replied, "If the LORD does not help you, where can I get help for you? From the threshing floor? From the winepress?" <sup>28</sup> Then he asked her, "What's the matter?" She answered, "This woman said to me, 'Give up your son so we may eat him today, and tomorrow we'll eat my son.' <sup>29</sup> So we cooked my son and ate him. The next day I said to her, 'Give up your son so we may eat him,' but she had hidden him."

## **Fulfillment in the Southern Kingdom (Jerusalem):**

2 Kings 25:1-3. So in the ninth year of Zedekiah's reign, on the tenth day of the tenth month, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon marched against Jerusalem with his whole army. He encamped outside the city and built siege works all around it. The city was kept under siege until the eleventh year of King Zedekiah. By the ninth day of the fourth month the famine in the city had become so severe that there was no food for the people to eat.
