






Hebrews 8:5 ...as Moses was divinely instructed when he was about to make the tabernacle. For He said, "See that you make all things according to the pattern shown you on the mountain."







Exodus 36:8 Then all the gifted artisans among them who worked on the tabernacle made ten curtains woven of fine linen, and of blue [*Majesty*], purple [*Royalty*], and scarlet [*Sacrifice*] thread; with artistic designs of cherubim they made them. 9 The length of each curtain was twenty-eight cubits (*42 feet*), and the width of each curtain four cubits (*6 feet*); the curtains were all the same size. 10 And he coupled five curtains to one another (*30 feet by 42 feet*), and the other five curtains he coupled to one another.




Exodus 36:11 He made loops of blue yarn on the edge of the curtain on the selvedge of one set; likewise he did on the outer edge of the other curtain of the second set. 12 Fifty loops he made on one curtain, and fifty loops he made on the edge of the curtain on the end of the second set; the loops held one curtain to another. 13 And he made fifty clasps of gold, and coupled the curtains to one another with the clasps, that it might be one tabernacle (bottom curtain of the tabernacle was a total of 60 feet by 42 feet).




Together, the tabernacle's Most Holy Place and the Holy Place measured 15 feet wide and 45 feet long. Holy of Holies was 15 foot cubed



Exodus 36:14-15. He made curtains of goats' hair for the tent over the tabernacle; he made eleven curtains (*one more than the first*). The length of each curtain was thirty cubits (*45 feet, 3 feet longer than the curtain it covered*), and the width of each curtain four cubits (*six feet, same as first curtain*); the eleven curtains were the same size.



Exodus 36:16-18. He coupled five curtains by themselves and six curtains by themselves. And he made fifty loops on the edge of the curtain that is outermost in one set, and fifty loops he made on the edge of the curtain of the second set. He also made fifty bronze clasps to couple the tent together, that it might be one.



The Practical Purpose for Goat Hair

Traditional nomadic tents are made from goat hair.

It is strong when twisted together and the weave pattern loosens in extreme heat allowing air to flow while blocking wind and direct rays of the sun.




Second, when rain falls the woven goat hair contracts making the weave tighter. The natural oils of the goat hair and the tighter weave help to naturally repel the rain protecting anyone and anything valuable under its cover!




Exodus 36:19 Then he made a covering for the tent of ram skins dyed red, and a covering of badger skins above that.

Exodus 36:20 For the tabernacle he made boards of acacia wood, standing upright. 21 The length of each board was ten cubits (*15 feet*), and the width of each board a cubit and a half (*2.25 feet*).




Exodus 36:22 Each board had two tenons for binding one to another. Thus he made for all the boards of the tabernacle. 23 And he made boards for the tabernacle, twenty boards for the south side.



Exodus 36:24 Forty sockets of <u>silver</u> [*Redemption – Lev* 27] he made to go under the twenty boards: two sockets under each of the boards for its two tenons.



Exodus 36:23-26 (excerpts) And he made boards for the tabernacle, twenty boards for the south side. For the other side of the tabernacle, the north side, he made twenty boards



Exodus 36:27-30 For the west side of the tabernacle he made six boards. He also made two boards for the two back corners of the tabernacle. And they were coupled at the bottom and coupled together at the top by one ring. Thus he made both of them for the two corners. So there were eight boards and their sockets — sixteen sockets of silver — two sockets under each of the boards.



Exodus 36:31-34. And he made bars of acacia wood: five for the boards on one side of the tabernacle, five bars for the boards on the other side of the tabernacle, and five bars for the boards of the tabernacle on the far side westward. And he made the middle bar to pass through the boards from one end to the other. He overlaid the boards with gold, made their rings of gold to be holders for the bars, and overlaid the bars with gold.



Exodus 36:35 And he made a veil of blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen; it was worked with an artistic design of cherubim.

Exodus 36:36 He made for it four pillars of acacia wood, and overlaid them with gold, with their hooks of gold; and he cast four sockets of silver for them.



Exodus 36:37 He also made a screen for the tabernacle door, of blue, purple, and scarlet thread, and fine woven linen, made by a weaver, 38 and its five pillars with their hooks. And he overlaid their capitals and their rings with gold, but their five sockets were bronze [Judgment/Justice].
